Linkblog.io is intentionally minimal, with a focus on text and typography, and aims to be a robust link management tool.

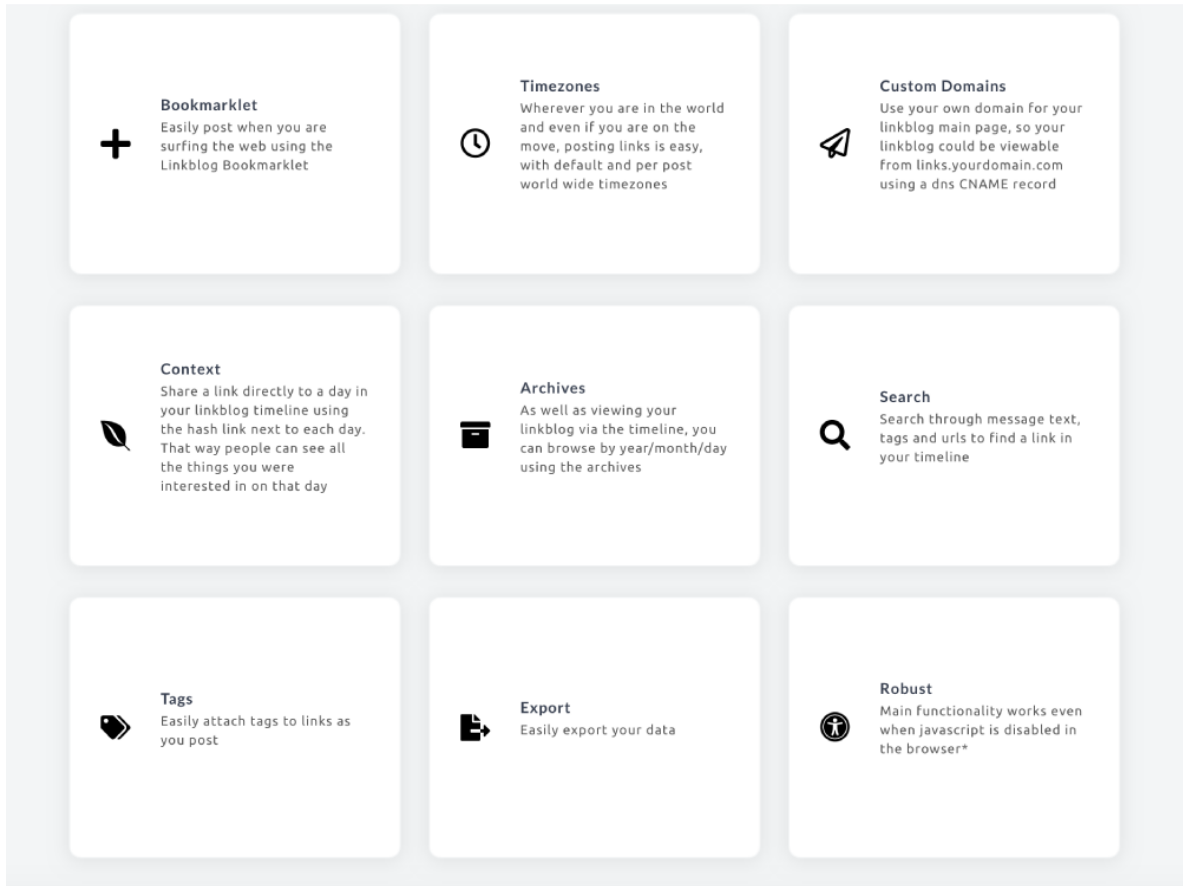
A linkblog is a reverse chronological list of web links, grouped by day. That's the clinical, literal description.

After a while though, a funny thing happens, the list of links becomes something a bit more like a utility belt for browsing the web, a frictionless way of sharing something online, a portal to interesting things, your own personal island of calm and quiet amongst the hectic and frantic world of the internets.

It's great for saving something to read later, something you read and liked or found interesting, something that might come in handy some time in the future. It's also a pretty great way to create some context around you and your business, as a research tool and for working in the open.



Where is the Welcome page?

The welcome page is the first page you see when you activate your account and login. It's a fairly rudimentary onboarding page, listing the 3 steps you take to setup your account. There will be a link to the welcome page here once you are logged in. You can get to the welcome page [here](#).

Which pages are public?

Your main linkblog page is public and is accessible at <https://linkblog.io/users/yourusername>. Your archives and the search page are also publically accessible and linked to from your main page. Once you log in via the login page, you will see additional icons in the navbar to post messages, edit your linkblog messages, manage your profile settings, and logout.

What is a highlightable message link?

It's a way to [link directly to a specific message in a day](#). Use the search page to find a message and the links in the search results are all highlightable message links. Running a search with an empty search box will return all the messages in reverse chronological order.

What is a bookmarklet?

It is a bit of javascript that you add to your web browser (Chrome, Firefox, Safari, Edge etc) bookmarks bar, and it appears as a clickable button. It's a quick way to post a new message.
